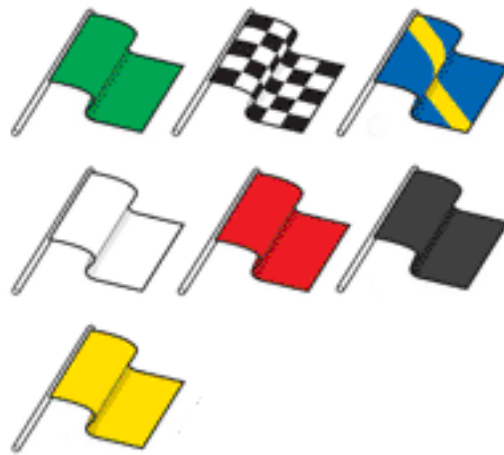




2017 Flag Meanings



GREEN FLAG

Go!

The green flag is waved by the starter to indicate the beginning of the race. It is waved after a caution to tell the drivers that the race has been restarted. The green flag also is an indication that the track is clear of any obstacles or debris.

YELLOW FLAG

Caution

The yellow flag is the signal for caution. Drivers must slow and not pass, although they can close the distance to the car immediately in front.

RED FLAG

Stop!

The red flag often means the track has been completely blocked by an accident, debris, or an emergency vehicles and there is no safe route through the problem. As soon as a red flag is shown, drivers must come to a stop as quickly and safely as possible.

YELLOW/RED FLAG

Restart

The red and yellow flags crossed means the 1st lap was not completed by all racers. This is a total restart of the race.

BLACK FLAG

(Infraction)

The black flag generally means that there has been an infraction which requires consultation with the track officials. If the black flag is rolled up you are doing something wrong. If the black flag waving take your car to the pit immediately.

BLUE/YELLOW FLAG

Passing and Overtaking

The blue and yellow flag or passing flag means that there is a faster lead lap car coming up from behind. Move out of the racing groove and allow him to pass.

WHITE/GREEN FLAG

Half way

The Green and White flags crossed means this the half way point in the race.

WHITE FLAG

Final lap

The white flag indicates that it is the final lap of the race.

CHECKERED FLAG

Finish Line

The checkered flag is waved by the starter to indicate the finish of the race. The checkered flag is waved for all vehicles on track.
